

Evaluation Method: Evaluation Wheel

Overview

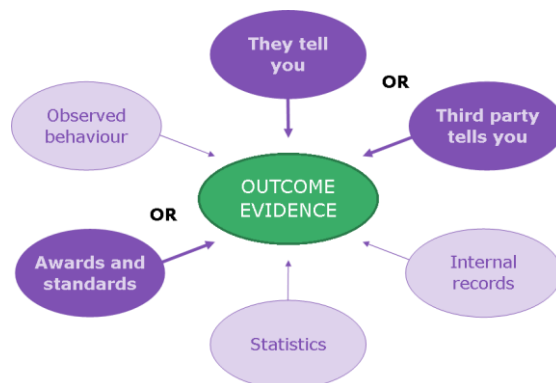
Creative and flexible tool to collect information on outcomes in a simple and accessible manner.

What's required

Form to record observations. Most wheels take less than 15 minutes to complete.

Process

- Decide on the information you want to collect (most probably your outcome indicators).
- Decide if you want numbers on the "spokes" of your evaluation wheel.
- Decide whether this will be a 1-1 or group exercise.
- Explain that for each indicator the participant draws a line out from the centre of the wheel. The closer their line is to the circumference the happier they are with that indicator.
- Responses can be discussed further with the person or group.



Capturing evidence

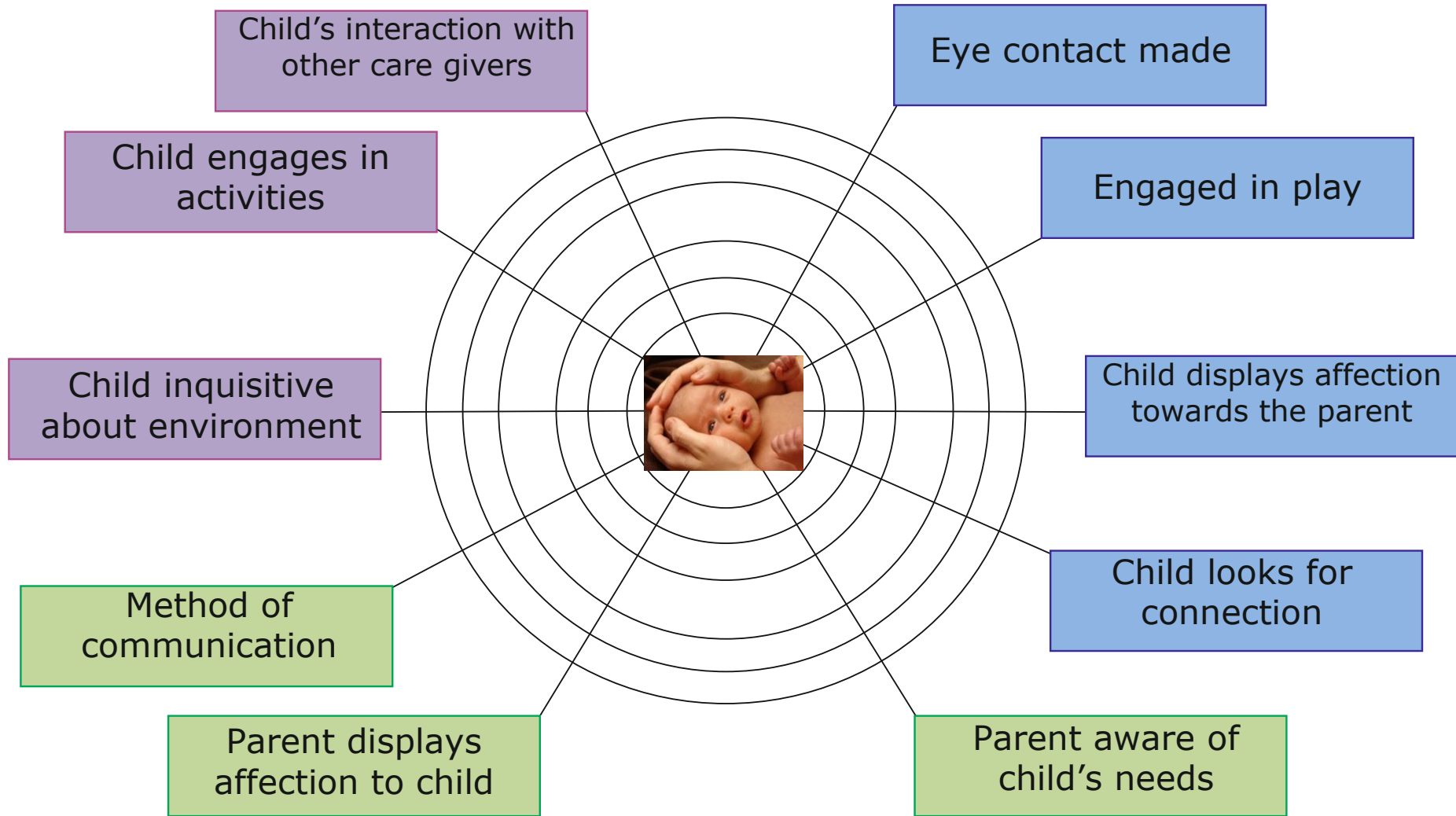
The tool will capture the information and can be supplemented with other notes if necessary.

Useful for

- Provides many different types of information.
- Showing journeys of change – results can be made into a spider diagram and overlaid giving a visual representation of progression.
- Results can be aggregated into wheels for annual reports.
- Simple analysis as it is essentially a scale questionnaire in circle form.



Example



Outcomes: Blue = Child improved emotional health
Green = Improved emotional health/Parenting skills
Purple = Safe environments/Better family bonds

Centre of circle – 1 reaching out to edge – 6
